City Council awarded £28,936 grant for pump track at Waunfawr

St Davids City Council has been successful in its bid for a £28,936 grant for the construction of a new pump track at Waunfawr. The grant has been made by Pembrokeshire County Council from funding raised via the Second Homes tax. The pump track, which will be for the use of bike riders of all ages and in particular riders of mountain bikes, will be situated on the east side of Waunfawr playing field, adjoining the keep fit exercise area and opposite the skate board park both projects initiated by the City Council in the past few years. The track, a complete circuit, will



have a series of rollers, banked turns and features for the bikers to 'pump' their way around working up speed as they go. See our artist's impression of what the St Davids track will look like.



Community Award Winners 2022





Tributes paid to late Mr John Beynon



Many tributes have been paid to the late Mr John Beynon formerly Penlan Farm who died last December. member of long established family in the city Mr Beynon farmed at the cathedral farm Penlan for many years. John took an active part in the civic life of St



Davids and was several times chairman of the former St Davids Community Council, and at the cathedral church he was a Church Warden for many years. He was also immensely involved in many aspects of agriculture throughout the county, and was especially prominent in the promotion of Welsh Black Cattle. In St Davids he founded the Tyddewi Herd, which won many prizes both in Pembrokeshire and further afield. John served as both President of the Welsh Black Cattle Society and also, together with his wife Pauline, as a founder of Welsh Black Marketing Ltd. He was immensely proud to have been awarded the Sir Brynner Jones Award, the top prize at the Royal Welsh Show, the Arthur Pritchard Prize at the Fishguard Show and the **Idris Davies** Memorial Trophy Pembrokeshire County Show, of which he also served as President. He was also appointed an Associate and later Fellow of the Royal Agricultural Societies. John and Pauline hosted the Welsh Black Cattle Society at Penlan and went with the Society to Australia in 2008.

Pembrokeshire gears up to help Ukrainian refugees Language skills needed



Pembrokeshire County Council and voluntary organisations are teaming up to be ready for the arrival of Ukrainian refugees in our county, under the central co-ordination of the community hub originally set up a few years ago to assist Syrian refugees.

The hub, which has most recently been involved in helping the community cope with the pandemic, is now actively seeking volunteers to help it with its new task, especially people with language skills. Languages in demand could include Ukrainian itself, Russian, Crimean, Tatar, Moldavian, Hungarian, Romanian and Bulgarian, all of which are spoken in Ukraine.

The hub which is working with PAVS and other agencies is planning to be instrumental in assisting refugees as they move into Pembrokeshire. County Council Chief Executive Will Bramble has said that it is truly heartening to see community groups already working to coordinate a response to the crisis.

Dr Middleton celebrates his 100th Birthday

Dr George Middleton, MBE, has celebrated his 100th Birthday. The birthday party was held at his home in January and attended by a large number of his family and friends and was presented with a congratulatory certificate by the Mayor of St Dr Middleton has Davids, Cllr Alan York. devoted his life to public service in so many ways. In St Davids firstly as a doctor, but also as a very active member of our community. For many years a councillor on the former St Davids Parish Council he served on several occasions as chairman. He was also Chairman of the PCNPA and has latterly been an active member of the Friends of the National Park. In his early years in the city he was much involved with the St Davids Red Cross Society and its cadets. But undoubtedly his greatest commitments have been to life saving at sea. Firstly to the RNLI, of which he is a life governor, and the St Davids lifeboat station of which he still serves as president, and also as a founder member of the Porth Mawr Surf Life Saving Club. He has also worked closely with the St Davids Coastguard unit and has been immensely involved with the work of the Air Sea rescue helicopters of the Royal Navy and the RAF at Brawdy, pioneering many new ideas and practices, which led to him becoming medical adviser to the St Davids lifeboat crew. Over the years he has also been much involved with the cathedral where until very recently he worked as a voluntary guide, and he remains President of the Friends of St Davids Cathedral. He is also an enthusiastic member of the Cathedral Men's Society. A founder member of the St Davids Historical Society, he has himself written and published books on the history of St Davids and also the lifeboat station.





Tribute to NHS at Cathedral Festival

A tribute to the NHS for all that they have done to look

after us during the pandemic will take centre stage at the Cathedral Festival as it returns after its two year's silence. The concert which will feature the NHS Choir will take the form of a family prom at the Bishop's Palace organised in conjunction with Cadw. The festival will also be offering special tickets for festival events to all NHS workers in Pembrokeshire.

The Festival running from 27th May - 5th June will be returning in style with a scintillating programme of classical music celebrating the platinum jubilee of its Royal Patron ,HM The Oueen.

Once again the festival will feature some of the world's top instrumentalists, soloists, choirs, ensembles and orchestras, including in this special year violin virtuoso Rachel Podger with vocal ensemble VOCES8, Canadian superstar pianist Stewart Goodyear, chart topping saxophonist Jess Gillam, the Early Music group Florilegium, Wales' leading professional folk band Ar Log, Alis Huws Harpist to HRH The Prince of Wales, the Morriston Orpheus Male Voice Choir, the British Sinfonietta, and the BBC National Orchestra of Wales in a concert to be recorded for BBC Radio 3

As always the festival will create a platform for young people from this peninsula with the traditional children's opening concert.

Florilegium will give an all Bach Concert recalling the festival's earlier traditions, and our cathedral choirs will perform a Platinum Jubilee concert of Royal music with the British Sinfonietta, while Vox Angelica, the Vicars Choral and Choral Scholars will give a candlelit performance of *A Song for the Commonwealth*.

Other events will include workshops for young musicians, the winning Dyfed Young Musician of the Year, a family Queen's Castle sand castle competition, music and theatre workshops and talks by eminent speakers including the journalist and architectural historian Simon Jenkins on his book *Europe's 100 Best Cathedrals*.

A festival of firsts - Ar Log will premier a suite of songs composed by Paul Maelor with lyrics by poet Grahame Davies, and the BBC concert will see a first performance of *Landsker* by local composer Alex Mills. There will also be exhibitions featuring Thomas Tomkins, treasures from the cathedral library and Royal visits to St Davids.

The year was one of tremendous upheaval and of turmoil. Because of lockdown we did not meet in the City Hall until September. However, we were well supplied with virtual talks, mainly from our committee, but also from other members of the Society. Sadly we have lost two members who gave us talks in the past, John Beynon and Richard Hellon who have died.

In January, we were delighted to read a piece on St Mary's College from some writings of Kay Halliwell, wife of Canon Halliwell. These notes were discovered by her son Tom and annotated by him. Further historical notes were added by Sally Martyn

In February, Paul Edey provided us with an extract from 'Sunday at Home', a monthly tract 'suitable reading for families' which was in print from 1854 to 1940. This article was about St Davids Cathedral but the description of St Davids itself is not alluring. You are told that you will pass through 'the decayed streets of the obscure hamlet' on the way to the Cathedral.

In March, the virtual talk comprised notes by Mike Marshman on the Poor Law. He gave us a brief overview of the history of poor relief prior to 1834 when the Poor Law Amendment act was passed which made it more difficult to obtain aid and put people into workhouses rather than leaving them in their own homes in their parish. After 1834, St Davids was one of 63 parishes in the Haverfordwest Poor Law Union and many people were sent to Haverfordwest Workhouse.

In April, Gerry Martyn provided an article on 'A Mining Disaster' at Treginnis Copper Mine on 2nd May 1883, when a workman, John Reynolds, fell 15 feet to the bottom of the shaft when he was being winched up. An inquest followed on May 24th and was reported in the *Tenby Observer*. Evidence was taken from several people and the final verdict was that it was an accident, and no-one was to blame. A private charge of manslaughter was brought by Reynolds' widow and brother on June 15th but this was dismissed.

In May, Helen Silverstone wrote about the non-conformist chapels in St Davids. She wrote about the growth nationally of non-conformism and then gave brief histories of Ebeneser, Seion and Tabernacl. Many of our members may have recognized their younger selves in the photos of the congregations.

In June, Sally Martyn wrote about the stone heads carved on the outside of the Cathedral. These are thought to be based on local people whom the masons would have seen every day. There are about 100 of these heads including remnants of carving blocks where heads once resided. Most are found on each side of windows and the ones on the south side of the cathedral are in better repair than those on the north side.

In July, Paul Edey shared with us a 'Memorial relating to the Cathedral Church of St Davids and the country adjacent as it was in the latter end of Queen Elizabeth's Reign'. Paul showed us what the spelling of the manuscript was like at the time and then the whole in modern English. Sally Martyn kept us up to date on the archaeological dig at St Patrick's Chapel.

In August, Gerry Martyn wrote about the Very Revd. James Allen, Dean from 1878 to 1895. Dean Allen is best remembered for his building programme both at the Cathedral, to which he contributed his personal money and in various parishes in Pembrokeshire. He was well-known for his charitable works both in Pembrokeshire and more widely. He became Dean when he was 76 and died in 1897 aged 95.

We were delighted in **September** to return to talks in the City Hall when Bishop Wyn Evans spoke to us about another Dean, Dean Lewellin and showed us his walking stick upon which were noted all the posts he held, some simultaneously and some consecutively. **In October**, the Archdeacon of Carmarthen, the Venerable Dorrien Davies, spoke to us about the role of an archdeacon and, also, raised the question of the difficulties facing the Church in Wales today. **In November**, Luke Jenkins, one of the archaeologists on the Whitesands dig, brought us up to date on the various excavations there have been at the site up to the present day.

In December, we were unable to hold our usual Christmas dinner, so we decided to send out a Christmas mailing instead. The centre piece of this was an article by Rev Wiliam Owen of Tabernacl chapel about the Christmas Day Plygain service. There was also a Christmas quiz and a short piece on the history of some popular carols.

We have now re-started our face-to-face talks in the City Hall. From April onwards we shall be opening our talks to non members and will start with a dip into the Society's photographic archive with a talk by Paul Edey. We look forward to seeing you.
